I went to the supermarket the other day, and it happened to me again. I found myself marveling at all the varieties, colors, and sheer volume of items from which to choose. There are certainly all kinds of foods and other necessities which help fill our basic needs. The experience of shopping in a supermarket seems to call forth in me a reaction of "wow." It also prompts a prayer of thanks to God for His bountiful gifts. I feel blessed in such a place. I think that happens because I remember the time I visited a poor section of Peru many years ago and recall how only plain black and white advertising appeared on the packages in the stores there, no brightly colored boxes of cereal. There wasn't much variety, either, just the basics. And the people were very poor. They were not able to make choices from a smorgasbord such as that which is offered in our supermarkets.

Then, there are the people who are shopping around me! Young, old, families, single people, well-to-do, and those not so... all coming to fill a need. Some struggle a bit more than others to obtain what they need, depending on food stamps. But, shopping for food is something we all have in common. It's basic, it's a necessity to live. A well-organized system of food production, delivery and marketing helps make it all possible, but only after God's providential care sees to it that the seeds grow into beans, corn, wheat...

A supermarket may not, at first, seem like a place to reflect and pray. But, I just can't seem to avoid letting my mind and heart wander. Maybe it can become for you a meditation on being blessed, a reflection on those around you who are desperate to fill their hunger, or a chance to marvel at what our country, and its freedoms and its development, with the grace of God, have allowed us to enjoy.

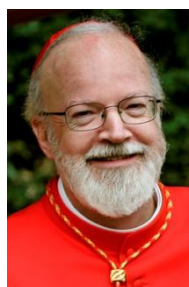
