

A Note from Fr. Bill....

Dear Friends,

For three weekends I've been away getting a new knee and I suspect I'll be away a week or two more so that I can walk with dignity and grace. It has been quite an experience. My first major visit to a hospital since my tonsils came out when I was seven. All the stories about what to look for – pain, more pain and still more pain. I am happy to report that the medical staff has wonderful pain management programs to make the pain very tolerable. So that was good news.

After the pain management came the rehab. Two weeks done and some more to follow is the prescription. The medical staff was wonderful with the surgery and recovery, the rehab teams were equally skilled at teaching me how to straighten my leg (not easy as it sounds) and walk with this new piece of me! I am still a work in progress.

I am very grateful for the cards, notes and visits which really made my days pass quickly. Thank you!! But best of all God located me and took me away from the "poor me's." I got a note from a friend whose family I have known forever. This young woman sent a text to me to tell me that her elderly mother was very sick, close to death. So I wrote immediately and found that the mother was in the BID hospital in Plymouth, a block away from me. So she came quickly and then was the task of getting me, my new leg and my walker into the car. The angels smiled.

We got to my friend's room. Just this dear elderly woman, her daughter, and me. What a moment of grace. We talked. We prayed. She said quite definitely she is not ready to die. So we chatted a bit, I kissed her goodnight and the daughter brought me back to the rehab.

To this note of sadness was added one of the therapists "catching me" coming back and wondering where I had been. We chuckled the next day.

The next morning my young friend called to tell me her mother changed her mind and was going to let God call her home. They gathered the local family to say goodbye to this dear woman. Eventually, her daughter was alone with her mother and she died peacefully and beloved early in the morning.

How great is our God! Hope to see you all soon.

Dear Parishioners, We are honored that Holy Family will once again be having a second collection this weekend to benefit Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos (NPH), which means "Our Little Brothers and Sisters" in Spanish. Last year, NPH supported 9,000 vulnerable or orphaned children in our homes in nine countries in Latin America and the Caribbean, along with St. Damien Pediatric Hospital in Haiti. We ensure the children have the basic items needed for survival, an education, career and vocational training, gender equality and caring adult role models to guide their values.

Last year, over \$7,000 was raised by Holy Family parishioners to support the children in our care! This weekend's second collection will support 159 children and adults living in an NPH home with disabilities. These individuals are predominantly wheel chaired, require 24/7 individualized care, specialized food, medicines and vast assortment of therapies. Without a family, NPH will be their home their entire lives. NPH stretches its pennies, and costs on average \$5,400 a year per individual for all services and staff needed for care. Please consider supporting our children with disabilities this weekend. We continue to be grateful for all those who have traveled to our home to see our mission, who sponsor a child, and for those who continue to donate during the second collection.

APPALACHIA SERVICE PROJECT 2025 REGISTRATION NOW OPEN - ASP is back to celebrate Holy Family's 20th mission trip to support this wonderful organization! We

are hoping that this year will be the largest and best trip yet - so please help spread the word. We're aiming to bring more than 100 teens and adult chaperones from Holy Family Parish to West Virginia to help change the lives of others. Appalachia Service Project "ASP" is a Christian service organization that repairs homes for the poorest of the poor in the Appalachian mountain regions of West Virginia, Tennessee and Kentucky. As any teen or adult who has participated in ASP can attest, they go to help serve others, but return forever changed themselves. This trip gives the young adults of our parish an opportunity to put their faith into action and experience the true joy of serving others. It is an invaluable life lesson for them. 
