

#### Pastor's Corner

On October 4, 2025, Pope Leo XIV issued his first official document, an apostolic exhortation entitled Dilexi Te ("I Have Loved You"), making as his own the draft of a text unfinished by his predecessor, Pope Francis. Apostolic exhortations are among the Church's most personal and pastoral teachings—letters from the pope that inspire, guide, and challenge the faithful to live the Gospel more deeply. In this document, Pope Leo invites us to renew our love for the poor by imitating Christ through simplicity, humility, compassion and service to those most in need. By doing so, he says, we will be led to a more meaningful and purposeful existence.

Here are some notable quotes from the apostolic exhortation. Referring to one central element of Catholic social teaching, the preferential option for the poor, Pope Leo writes, "I am convinced that the preferential choice for the poor is a source of extraordinary renewal both for the Church and for society, if we can only set ourselves free of our self-centeredness and open our ears to their cry." "This is not a matter of mere human kindness but a revelation: contact with those who are lowly and powerless is a fundamental way of encountering the Lord of history. In the poor, he continues to speak to us." "Works of mercy are recommended as a sign of the authenticity of worship, which, while giving praise to God, has the task of opening us to the transformation that the Spirit can bring about in us, so that we may all become an image of Christ and his mercy towards the weakest. In this sense, our relationship with the Lord, expressed in worship, also aims to free us from the risk of living our relationships according to a logic of calculation and self-interest." "Let me state once again that the most important way to help the disadvantaged is to assist them in finding a good job, so that they can lead a more dignified life by developing their abilities and contributing their fair share. ... On the other hand, where this is not possible, we cannot risk abandoning others to the fate of lacking the necessities for a dignified life. Consequently, almsgiving remains, for the time being, a necessary means of contact, encounter and empathy with those less fortunate."

## MARY, QUEEN OF MARTYRS "ALL ARE WELCOME" MINISTRY


Families and friends of the LGBTQ+ Community are invited to join in the following events:


